

Entrepreneurs Get Down to Business

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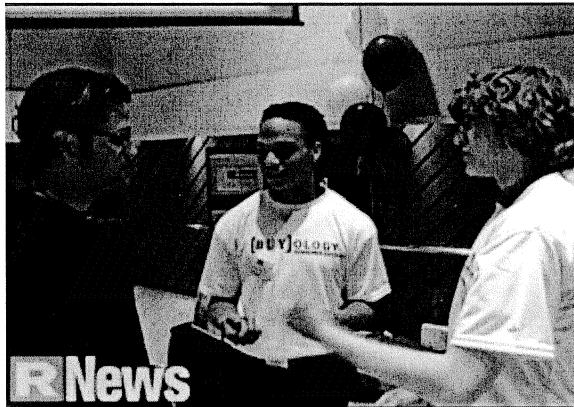
More than two dozen entrepreneurs showed off their products and services at a trade show Thursday evening.
